Barron Gorge Hydroelectric Power Station

Barron Gorge Hydroelectric Power Station was commissioned in 1963 and is one of Queensland's oldest renewable energy assets.

As a run-of-river hydro, the power station uses natural water inflows from the Barron River and if required, more water from Tinaroo Falls Dam to generate electricity.

Water is captured at the Kuranda Weir, where it is diverted underground to the station's two 33MW generators. When the water passes through these generators, it can generate up to 66MW of clean energy. The water is returned to the Barron River in the same condition it entered the power station.

CleanCo uses the energy generated by Barron Gorge to provide our large commercial and industrial customers with tailored clean energy solutions to help them reduce their carbon footprint.



Did you know?

- The Barron Gorge Hydro that operates today is the second of its kind. The original was commissioned in 1932 and had a capacity of just 3.8MW.
- 66MW is enough energy to power approximately 50,000 Queensland homes.

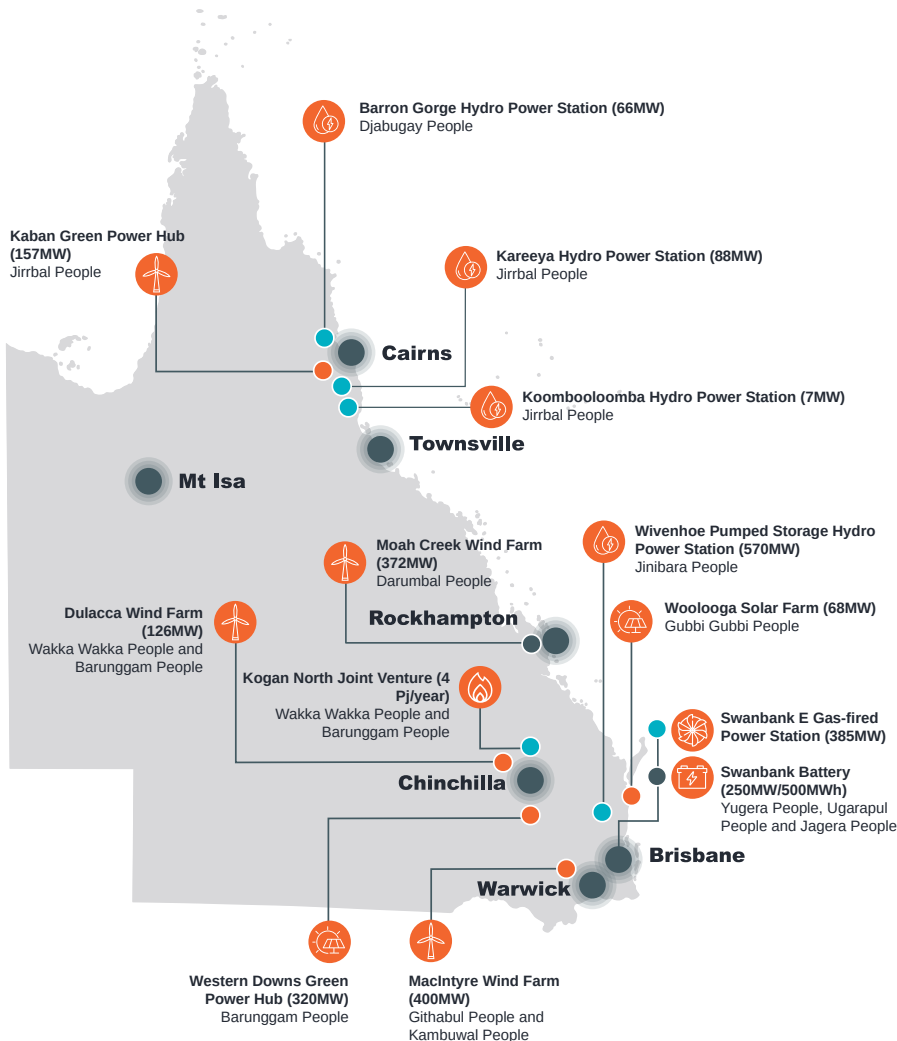

CleanCo's approach to sustainability is guided by a framework which comprises six priority areas:

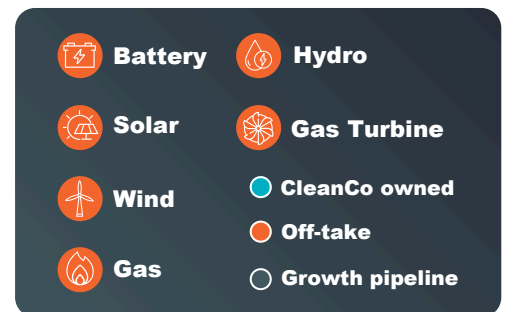
- Land and environment
