Kareeya Hydroelectric Power Station

Commissioned in 1957, the Kareeya Power Station is a run-of-river hydroelectric plant located in Far North Queensland near Tully.

Beginning at the purpose-built Koombooloomba Dam, water flows through Koombooloomba Hydro (7MW) then down the Tully River to Kareeya Hydro, where it goes through four powerful 22MW generators to produce a total of 88MW - enough energy to power the equivalent of 77,000 Queensland homes per year.

After the water has been used, it's released back into the Tully River in the same condition as when it entered the power station.

CleanCo uses the energy generated by Kareeya to provide our large commercial and industrial customers with tailored clean energy solutions to help them reduce their carbon footprint.



Did you know?

- The site team uses a cable car for transportation to Koombooloomba Dam.
 Without the cable car, the quick 15minute journey would take 3 hours by road.
- Cardstone Village, which included a post office, school and 29 houses was established in 1955 to accommodate workers constructing the power station. The village was closed in 1990.


